

# ST JUDE'S DETAIL

Knitted square using intarsia

## Materials

- Rowan Felted Tweed, shades Clay (177), Shadow (224) and Carbon (159)
- Rowan Kidsilk Haze, shade Lustre (686)
- 1 pair 3.25mm knitting needles

## Tension

23 stitches & 34 rows = 10 cm

## Instructions

Cast on 45 stitches using one strand each of Clay and Lustre, knitted together

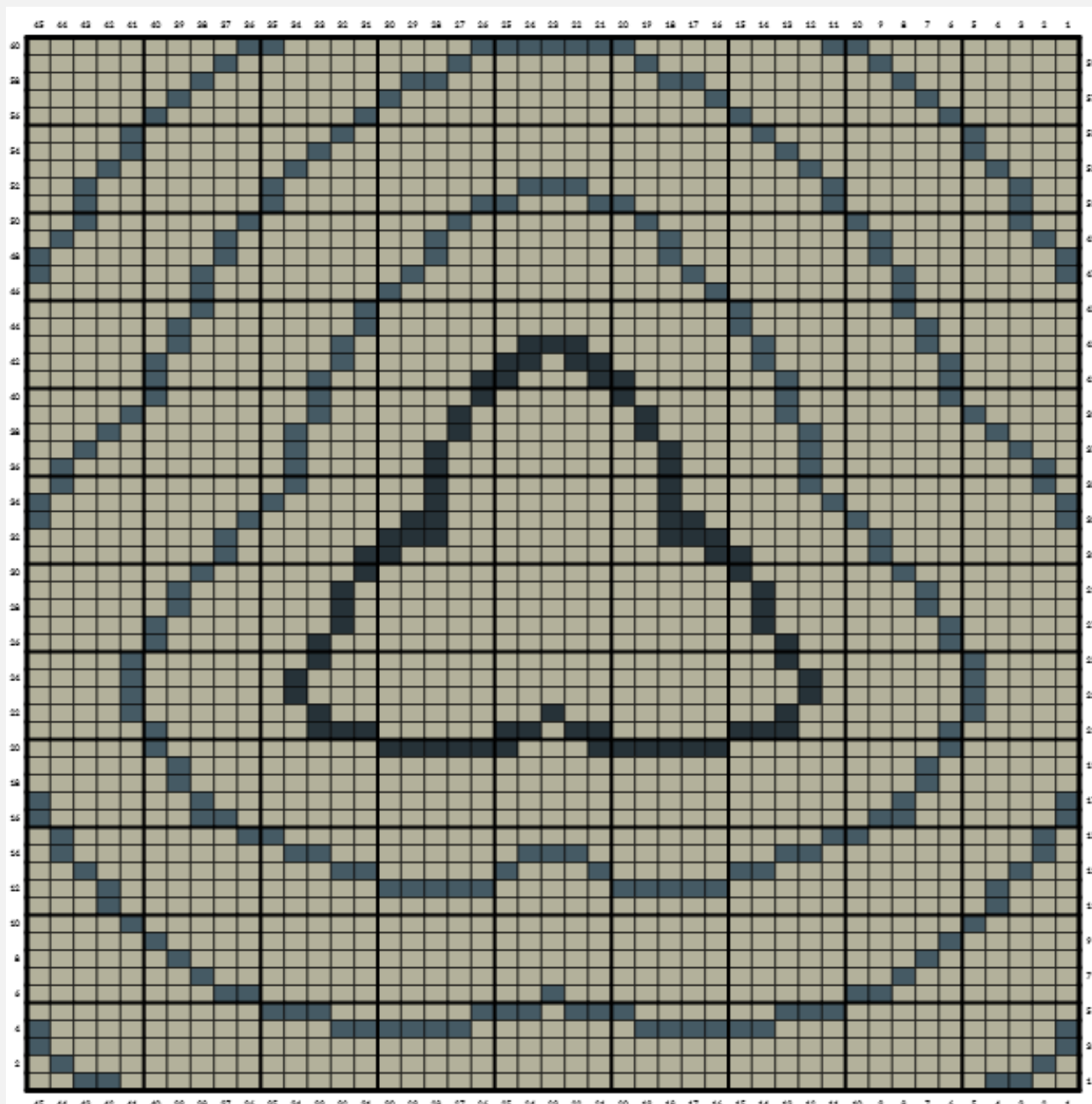
Follow the intarsia chart on p.2

- knit on RS, purl on WS
- use Shadow and Carbon for the intarsia detail

After Row 60, with RS facing, cast off stitches knitwise

## Project notes

- If you have not knitted intarsia before, YouTube is your friend.
- There is no need to load bobbins with Shadow and Carbon for the intarsia detail, simply cut strands that will be long enough to complete each line. You need just 2 strands of Carbon to take up each side of the central shape and 10 strands of Shadow to make each of the radiating lines.
- I'm no intarsia purist. Use stranded work to connect stitches here and there rather than introduce more strands for intarsia.
